longer 'laghu'. It has been growing continuously, expanding and flourishing, with around 700 branches across India. This shows how the small industries sector has become a pillar of our economy," he noted.

Shri. Kalyani said that such a massive transformation will only be possible if India evolves from being an innovation-led economy into a product nation—one that designs, owns, and manufactures its own intellectual property. “India aspires to grow at a double-digit economic trajectory, with eight times growth in GDP and a fifteen-fold rise in manufacturing. This transformation is immense, but achievable if India shifts from a resource-fueled economy to one powered by science, technology and design-led innovation,” Kalyani said.

He asserted that Make in India and Atmanirbhar Bharat would have true meaning only when Indian companies design their own products, own their intellectual property and manufacture at a scale within the country. “If you design the product yourself, own the IP yourself and manufacture it yourself, that is Atmanirbhar Bharat,” he said.

Addressing industry leaders at the 7th edition of India Manufacturing Show in Bengaluru, ISRO Chairman, Shri. Narayanan said India’s industry and startup ecosystem has become the backbone of the nation’s space achievements. “Almost 80 to 85 per cent of the systems in every ISRO mission are supplied by Indian industry. That shows the scale of their



contribution. The strength of our space programme is not only in science and engineering but in the power of Indian manufacturing,” he said

Shri. Narayanan said ISRO currently partners with over 450 Indian companies, which have become an integral part of the space value chain. “In 2020, under the visionary leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the government announced space sector reforms. At that time, there were just three or four space startups. Today, India has more than 330 active startups working in the sector,” he said.

While, Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) Chairman Shri. Samir V. Kamat addressing industry captains said that the contribution of the Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector was very significant during Operation Sindoor. Dr. Kamat said. “I am proud to say that the contribution of MSMEs in all the indigenous systems which did very well in the recent Operation Sindoor is very significant.”

The DRDO Chief said that the country has moved from importing 70 percent of the weapon systems and sensors from abroad to placing 90 percent of the orders last year from Indian industries. “Today we live in very interesting times. There is a geopolitical churn going on. We are moving from a unipolar world to a multi-polar world. Today, if a nation has to ensure its economic growth it is very important that we ensure both external as well as internal security in the nation and for you to retain your sovereignty it is very important that you indigenously develop the critical technologies that are necessary to build the systems which are necessary to defend the country,” he said.

In the same vein, Shri. Arun Ramchandani, Senior Vice President & Head, L&T Precision Engineering and Systems said that the future belongs to India, with significant innovation taking place in the aerospace and defence sectors. Growth is now driven by both innovation and exports. With bold policies already in place, India’s strategy should focus on key technological priorities. Our emphasis must be on designing, manufacturing and delivering world-class systems.

While Shri. Pralhad Joshi, Union Minister for Parliamentary Affairs, Coal and Mines said that India's transformation from a major defence importer to a nation producing 90 percent of its defence requirements domestically marks a defining milestone in its journey toward self-reliance and national strength. "Earlier, 70 percent of our defence procurement was imported. Today, 90 percent comes from Indian industries," Joshi said.

On the other hand, Union Minister of State for MSMEs Sushri. Shobha Karandlaje said MSMEs are the backbone of India's industrial resurgence. The sector, she said, employs 30 crore people, contributes 30 percent to GDP, 45 percent to manufacturing output and 40 percent to exports. She urged large PSUs such as ISRO, DRDO, HAL, BEL and BHEL to integrate MSMEs into their supply chains.



Sushri. Karandlaje added that over 7 crore MSMEs are now registered on the Udyam Portal and the Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) has created 1 crore jobs, with 90 percent of subsidies benefiting micro and small units.

“Over 15,000 items once imported are now reserved for domestic production. This is not just economic progress it is the assertion of India's sovereignty” he said.

At the same forum, Bengaluru South Member of Parliament Shri. Tejasvi Surya said technological leadership is the true test of sovereignty. “Every defence product we make — whether N72 or P72 — proudly carries the mark ‘Born in Bharat.’ If we depend on others for technology, we import dependency. If we import technology, we export sovereignty,” he said.

Surya praised India's progress in semiconductors, quantum technology, renewable energy and defence innovation, urging the youth to pursue precision, discipline and excellence in manufacturing. “Only then can India rise to the top of the global supply chain,” he said.
